- But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, 23) Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.
- Faith—the word rendered "faith" occurs 244 times in 228 verses in the New Testament. It is various translated as follows by the King James translators: faith (239x), assurance (1x), believe (1x), belief (1x), them that believe (1x), fidelity (1x).
- Noah Webster's American Dictionary of the English Language defines "faith" as follows:

- "Faith" is an attribute of God. God is a faithful God. He cannot lie and be trusted in everything that he says.

- As the following screenshot for the OED demonstrates, in its noun form, "faith" is referring to faithfulness, fidelity, loyalty, and trustworthiness.



• In addition, there is an entry in the *OED* for the noun form of faith, "on the faith of." The phrase means, "in reliance on the security of."



- This is exactly what the "faith of Christ" means in this Gal. 2:16, rather than resting on our ability to keep the law, justification is secured by the work of Christ. Our justification is not based upon our faith/belief but upon the "faith of Christ" i.e, Christ's faithfulness, fidelity, trustworthiness, and security.
 - Matthew 26:36-39—Jesus Christ was faithful in his execution of the eternal purpose. He and He alone secured our justification for us via his activity on our behalf.
- Noah Webster's American Dictionary of the English Language defines the preposition "of "means:
 - "From or out of; proceeding from, as the cause, source, means, author or agent bestowing."
- The "faith of Christ" is the faith that belongs to Christ. It is a reference to His faithfulness.
 - Romans 3:3
- Galatians 5:22—genuine faith in Christ will result in faithfulness to Christ.
 - o II Corinthains 5:7
 - o I Corinthains 10:13

- o Ephesians 3:12—verse 11 is talking about "Christ Jesus our Lord." It is through the faith of Christ that we have access to the Father.

- Galatians 5:22—as a fruit of the Spirit, "faith" is contrasted with the works of the flesh in verses 19-21. As such I believe "faith" is related relying and trust in sufficiency of Christ and his word to get your needs met and not our own ability, strength, and power.
